They were, they were, and that was from the repository at County. No, that was from the County repository. They've already been through a public sale. Nobody wanted to purchase.

Earnie Telegraphis 08:48

The reason is, in the past, I'm not blaming these people here presently, in the past, the blocks of parcels that were given to these people who took the property for like \$1 on the barrel. Okay, and here we got one this past Saturday in the Mon Valley newspaper. You have Megan Kearns. She's got seven

properties here, and she's making \$30,000 each one. She got 212 thousand, how much did she pay for these properties? The problem, what are you looking at? What's more than transfer now come up with all these.

All the ones up on Rosravor and Grand Boulevard are in hand. Pick up one this evening from the mayor sent to the county, waiting on a couple to come back from the county. We're still waiting on the railroad, who's reviewing the engineering design of these. There are three or four people reaching out to the railroad try to get a response. Still working with Cleveland cliffs, the EQ tank is going to come back around. Spoke to the sewage authority solicitor this week. They did have some property issues for the site along Parente, they need to have clean title to make sure the borrowing is satisfied. The mayor and I do have a call with them and their engineer tomorrow for a status update. And I was working with you that the city clerk on an IRS issue, flight issue with how the city was reporting two. Initially it looked like the city was going to have a penalty of \$15,000. The city clerk was able to piece things together from about six years ago, and turns out the city is going to get a \$600 credit from the IRS. So that's some good news, and thanks to the city clerk for finalizing that. That's all I have this evening.

Deposits made \$540,709.55 expenses, \$336,752.57 the ending balance as of March 31 2025 was \$433,691.33 the outstanding checks, \$49,339.84 the outstanding deposits, \$3,067.97 the reconciled balance to the bank statement was \$387,419.46 that concludes my report, Mayor, thank you.

Tamika West 30:17

I'm Tamika West. I'm the Monessen youth baseball Association has changed over to different presidents and different every office and organization has changed. My department for the past two years has I'm the board president, and one thing I'd like to do is I'd like everybody know that baseball is back in town, and it's been back. They're building a dynasty. I only have a third grader, but we've already pulled out two champion tournaments with our Pinto team and then with our Bronco team. They're also tournament champions last year, and we're looking forward to keeping it going every year. But everyone doesn't know really about the little field up in Columbus, and not everybody drives past City Park all the time when the pony, we also have a pony league too, and the pony league are the boys that played Bronco last year that are now moving to pony. So, we're looking really forward to the boys bringing baseball into town, the World Series. That's, you know, we're a parent, so that's what we want one day. That's what we're looking forward to. But we want everybody to know how big baseball really is. And I would like to support the town by having a parade, something happy, something fun. You know, some trucks, fire trucks, ambulances are making some noise. We're going to invite the other divisions that we played with that are still a part of our league. We want to invite them and their bands as well to be able to walk through town and just let you know, hey, baseball is back in town. And we would like to do this on May 24 we just heard about the open house anywhere at like, two o'clock in the afternoon, and we just, like, loop from the bottom street up to the top, from Eastgate axon to Eighth Street on the credit union, and go around, and that would be off. But basically, we would give out schedules. You'll see them around town sometimes, but nobody really pays attention, because they're like, who's on the baseball team? What's baseball? Tell us that you got grants to repair the roads. Do we have grants to repair the roads?

We don't have grants, but we have repair roads being financed by the water company and the gas company.

We're talking about, Pacific, we're talking about Marion. Rostraver, 9th Street will be done through CDBG and Reed will be done through the cooperation of the City.

Oh and and Leeds. One half of Leeds will be done? Yes.

So you got five and a half rows. When do you anticipate? Parente is Grand Boulevard. They're a big mess.

Parente is a million dollar project. Soon as we find a million dollars, we'll do it,

Graham Avenue on the other side of the hilltop, yeah, that hasn't there's plenty of other roads we need to do before we get to that?

But these houses, you can go right on the internet and see these houses are normal houses. They are not trailers. And I wonder how Connellsville can do that, and we can't. It blows

my mind. How other communities are doing affordable housing, and it gives a person a two bedroom, three bedroom, a four bedroom house, and it's under the is it Fayette County Housing Authority? So how can they do it? And we are a different county. I can answer, okay, my suggestion is for you to call that Mayor or that person that's in charge of that project and find out how they did it so that maybe we can do it, because I think that those trailers up on Motheral doesn't help us at all. I'm so sorry, and I'm so disappointed who ever started that project because it wasn't for the best of Monessen. That's all I want to say on that part. The other part is Mihalic boat launch. Are we talking to the Army Corps of Engineers about how we are going to fix that boat launch?

And for years, that has been neglected. And I think it was 2012 when they built it, and then 2016 there was a problem. And now the. Barges are rotten through we can't go over there, go out on the landing to look out over the river. So my thing is, if we want people to come here and spend their money, we should have some type of pictures recreation area that they can enjoy their self at. What do we have? Karen had the flea market, and she wanted the people come here. What are they coming here for? Karen? Just tell me what? What do we have to offer anybody coming here? I'm not trying to be nasty or I'm not trying to be a bee, but my question is, why would you invite somebody into your town when we have nothing to offer? You don't have anything to offer to residents, and after all, it's our money that's running this town.
